Keep up-to-date with our Antenno App

Antenno is a mobile app that sends the user Council alerts and notifications about places and topics they care about. It is free to download and use, and it doesn't ask for any personal information or login details, so it's a nice easy way to stay informed. As well as receiving notifications, Antenno allows

users to report back to Council on issues or feedback. Antenno lets you choose the places you want to be alerted about, so you're not being alerted about things that don't matter to you. You can also opt out of topics that don't interest you.



HOW TO DOWNLOAD: Download the app from the App Store or Google Play and save places you care about, such as home, work, your holiday home or school.

Council Services at Te Ramanui o Ruapūtahanga



Just a reminder that Council services are operating out of Te Ramanui o Ruapūtahanga while the main Administration Building in Hāwera is closed for earthquake strengthening.

Council chief executive Fiona Aitken says the Hāwera Administration Building needs to be strengthened as it is the District's Civil Defence emergency operations centre and has to meet higher structural requirements than other buildings.
