Something we should know? Send us an Antenno

Antenno is a cellphone app that sends you alerts and notifications about places and topics you care about. It's free to download and use, and you can opt out of topics that aren't of interest to you. It doesn't ask for any personal information or login details, so it's a nice easy way to stay informed about Council related stuff.

Antenno lets you choose multiple "Places" (which could be the area you live in, work, where your children go to school, or where you like to exercise your dog) and then you will see updates from Council on community events, matters up for consultation, water shutdowns, changes to rubbish collections and much more.

You can also use Antenno to tell us about things that need fixing, or give us feedback, directly through the app! Antenno makes it easy for people to submit feedback or report issues such as a full public rubbish bin, damaged footpath, road pothole, graffiti or submit feedback or an idea to Council.



Leak detection work in Normanby, Kaponga and Manaia

If you see some people in high-vis vests walking the streets of Normanby, Kaponga and Manaia with what appears to be a listening device, don't panic - it's not the security services eavesdropping on your conversations! They are Council contractors checking for possible water leaks in the water reticulation network. This leak detection work will take about 1-2 weeks and covers around 48.3km of water pipe (Normanby – 14.5km, Manaia – 25km and Kaponga – 8.8km). It's all part of the Council's programme to improve our water infrastructure by identifying, then repairing leaks in the system. The contractors carry full ID and all the vehicles are sign written and fitted with flashing beacons.
